Surgeons of Hope's trip to Mexico was a success! We were able to meet with the team at the Hospital Infantil de México Federico Gómez (HIMFG), and assess their program, leadership, and facilities. The history of this hospital is as inspiring as its staff and It was a privilege for Surgeons of Hope to be invited. The visit was significant because in Mexico, congenital heart disease (CHD) is the second leading cause of death among children under five years of age. While the average global incidence of CHD is 6 to 8 per 1,000 live births, in Mexico it rises to 8-12 per 1,000 live births. The hospital performs roughly 280 surgeries per year on patients from underserved communities and even though there are several competent pediatric cardiac programs in Mexico, they are not sufficient to take care of all children with CHD. A long list of children awaiting these life-saving interventions remains. We believe in the HIMFG hospital's mission and work, and are eager to establish a long-term partnership.

"I am grateful for the invitation from the Surgeons of Hope Foundation to provide surgical expertise for the Foundation's trip to Hospital Infantil de Mexico Federico Gomez. We were warmly received by the physician and staff leadership of the hospital and heart center. The program was eager to share the many great historical accomplishments of their program and also learn about potential improvement opportunities. Our focus centered on the implementation of an extracorporeal membrane oxygenation program and its leadership. I was invited by the surgical chief of the program to assist with the repair of a 14 year old patient with tetralogy of Fallot.


Updates from the field

Sweet Alma, the youngest patient this round at just one month old, underwent percutaneous valvuloplasty, a procedure that improves blood flow, and recovered, beautifully.
